Winston Churchill

Winston Churchill was an inspirational statesman, writer, orator and leader who led Britain to victory in the Second World War. He served as Prime Minister of the United Kingdom from 1940 to 1945, during the Second World War, and again from 1951 to 1955.



Jane Austen

Jane Austen was an English novelist, renown for being the first author to give the novel its distinctly modern character through her treatment of ordinary people in everyday life. In her six published novels, she vividly depicted English middle-class life during the early 19th century

JMW Turner

Joseph Mallord William Turner RA, known in his time as William Turner, was an English Romantic painter, printmaker and watercolourist. He is known for his expressive colourisations, imaginative landscapes and turbulent, often violent marine paintings.



James Watts & Matthew Bolton

Boulton & Watt was a British engineering and manufacturing firm founded in 1775 by English manufacturer Matthew Boulton and Scottish engineer James Watt, which had an important role in the Industrial Revolution and grew to be a major producer of steam engines in the 19th century.
