ABOUT THE PROJECT

A Cat May Look at a King is an audio short story of a fictional cat called Lee, who lives in Leyton and wanders around observing the world around him and the changes that take place.

NBAM CIC has been working with residents who live with various disabilities to collect their memories, fictional stories and commentary about the local area, in order to devise a new story where participants' thoughts are incorporated. The cat in this story therefore metaphorically represents the thoughts and feelings of the different people engaged during the participation process.
